Holy Days of Obligation



The Code of Canon Law of the Catholic Church states that there are nine holy days of obligation in addition to Sundays, but it also says that the local conference of bishops may suppress some of them or transfer them to a Sunday. Bishops in the United States have suppressed the feast of Saint Joseph and the feast of Saints Peter and Paul as holy days of obligation. In addition, the feast of Epiphany is always celebrated on a Sunday in the United States. The other six Holy Days of Obligation are listed below.
